In 2015, I hung up my red apron and happily became a Sustainer. For the past few years, I have enjoyed watching the activities of the League, paying my dues, and showing up for an occasional Sustainer wine tasting. Gone were the days of placements, meetings, and ways and means shifts. I was enjoying the "season of life" that follows all the years of active League membership. However, when Sarah Giglio asked me to serve on the Board after a seven-year hiatus, I was ready to move into the next season...and I am also really bad at saying "no."

MENTORING AMBITIOUS GIRLS TO INSPIRE CHANGE (MAGIC)

MAGIC worked with Volunteers of America Teen Club to demonstrate positive examples of character and behavior. The young women were exposed to various presentations designed to expand their outlook, build self-esteem, and provide positive role models. Our volunteers continually adjusted the program based on ever changing COVID-19 conditions.

SAFE SITTER

The League's Safe Sitter program equipped area teens and tweens with the skills necessary to be safe and effective sitters. Hands on lessons in first aid, CPR, and other important skills were taught over two sessions. Safe Sitter offered one paid class and one class at no cost. The League partnered with the Salvation Army Boys and Girls Club to identify teens who would benefit from the program. League members became trained and certified to teach course participants medically accurate and developmentally appropriate training. Safe Sitter will sunset in the upcoming League year.

In the Spring of 2014, the Junior League of Shreveport-Bossier introduced a new community program called Safe Sitter to help educate our children in the community on how to be safe at home and while watching others. This fourhour course is designed to prepare students in grades 5 – 8 to be safe when they're home alone, watching younger siblings, or babysitting.

We cover the following skills: **Safety, Child Care, First Aid & Rescue,** and **Life & Business Skills.** In **Safety** students learn how to prevent unsafe situations and what to do when faced with dangers such as power failures or weather emergencies. In **Child Care,** students learn tips to manage behavior that will help them stay in control of themselves and the children in their care. Students also learn the ages and stages of child development, as well as practice diapering. In **First Aid & Rescue,** students learn skills such as a choking rescue for the different ages they may encounter and systems how to assess and respond to injuries and illnesses. In **Life & Business Skills,** students learn how to screen jobs, discuss fees, and greet employers to set these students up for success now and in the future. Students practice these skills through various role plays and games.

In March 2022, the League's Safe Sitter committee hosted a Spring Class of 24 students. The class was a huge success as we had informational teaching and videos, hands on training with choking and diapering, questions from students, and plenty of fun and games! This year's Safe Sitter program was led by this year's committee of Lesley Reed, Ashley Morgan, Chelsa Jackson-Reese, Christine Moody, and Elizabeth Crafts.

The Safe Sitter committee aims to host four classes;

The two courses for the general public charge a fee of \$50 and include several learning resources, a student instruction booklet, graduation certification, and food and drink during class. The community courses offered at local non-profit centers are free of charge to their students. Our partnership with local community centers aims to reach students whose family may not have financial access to courses such as Safe Sitter. The Junior League of Shreveport-Bossier remains committed to serving the community by educating and empowering the next generation of leaders.



COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (CAP)

The Junior League of Shreveport-Bossier operates a Community Assistance Program (CAP), which provides monetary grants for short-term critical needs of non-profits in the Shreveport-Bossier area that address critical human needs.

The Board was so excited to present a CAP grant to the Highland Center in March of this year. The Highland Center Ministries bring together local churches for coordinated outreach services, provides tens of thousands of meals to those in need, provides a free clothing closet, and provides resources to assist their clients in the achievement of financial stability.

The Highland Center applied for our CAP grant because their building developed a roof leak right above their commercial kitchen. Although they were able to get very reasonable bids to fix this roof leak, the cost to do so was going to significantly impact their budget. After reviewing their application, the JLSB Board voted unanimously to fund the entirety of their roof work, which was \$2,200. JLSB President Sarah Giglio and President-Elect Margaret McDonald presented the check to Highland Center volunteers, where the volunteers expressed their deepest appreciation for our grant.

Applications for CAP grants are accepted on a rolling basis, and may be awarded up to \$3,000. Such a grant may be awarded to a non-profit whose proposed project supports the mission/focus of the JLSB, addresses a critical human need, faces the possibility of a disruption of a program or service, has prospects for continued funding after exhaustion of the CAP grant funds, has an unforeseen need not covered by its budget or present financial services, has a volunteer component, must benefit the community at large, and whose clients will be significantly impacted by this grant. Juice of 1 lemon
4 garlic cloves, minced
1 teaspoon oregano
½ teaspoon kosher salt
¼ teaspoon freshly ground pepper

CHICKEN KABOBS

- 2 lbs. boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 yellow bell pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 green bell pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 red onion, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 red onion, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 8 ounces, whole button mushrooms
 - or cremini mushrooms

Whisk the olive oil, vinegar, lemon juice, garlic, oregano, salt and pepper in a bowl until combined.

Pour the marinade over the chicken in a nonreactive bowl and mix well. Marinate, covered, in the refrigerator for 4 hours or longer, stirring occasionally. Drain the chicken, reserving the marinade. Thread the chicken, bell peppers, onion and mushrooms alternately on skewers and brush with the reserved marinade.
